- working with governments and policy agencies to ensure research outcomes are applied to evidence-based solutions for sustainability challenges
- seeking new partnerships that tap into the breadth and depth of the network's research on sustainability

Promoting sustainability through education and engagement

Collectively, members of the U21 network have over 1,200,000 students and 250,000 staff. The influence that this academic community can have as citizens and leaders, now and in the future, is immense. Recognising that universities have a critical educational role, each member is committed to:
